
as *Ramazzini Award* recipient and *Ramazzini Lecturer* for the year 2000.

Dr. Bingham has consistently demonstrated her devotion for protecting the working women and men of the World. For this she is a recognized international hero.


Her pioneering work into the carcinogenicity of numerous chemicals has been widely recognized. As chairperson of the Standards Advisory Committee on Coke Oven Emissions for the U.S. Department of Labor her leadership led to the successful completion of the first standard in the United States for the protection of coke oven workers in the Steel Industry. She has been an active participant on numerous U.S. National Academy of Science committees.

Her selection by President Jimmy Carter to lead the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) resulted in the most comprehensive training programme for workers as well as the most significant number of new standards for worker protection in the history of OSHA. Her election and leadership, as the first President of the Collegium Ramazzini after the death of its founding President Dr. Irving J. Selikoff, demonstrated her international commitment to worker safety and health issues.

Another one of Dr. Bingham's greatest achievements is as a teacher. As Vice-President, Dean of the Graduate School, and professor at the University of Cincinnati, she continued her advocacy for worker safety and health. Her enlightenment of students to worker safety and health issues has ensured that her hundreds of students will carry her knowledge and passion for worker protection on to many new generations assuring that worker safety and health will continue to be a key component of medical practice, as envisioned four centuries ago by the person after whom this award is named: Bernardino Ramazzini. Her research, teaching, dedication, leadership and advocacy will ensure that prevention of work-related diseases will continue into the future and that workers and their families will fare better because of the dedicated work of Dr. Eula Bingham.
